Staff Uniforms

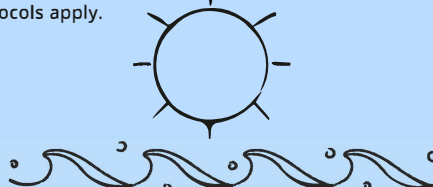
The hotel follows local, CDC and corporate guidelines. All staff wear masks as part of their daily uniform. Culinary teams and servers wear masks and gloves.
